About the event: The Mass of Installation is a special liturgy where the new Archbishop is formally seated and begins his ministry of service to the local Church.



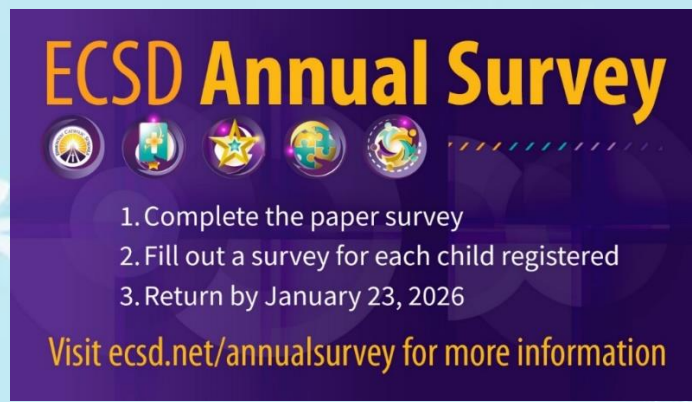

SCHOOL FEES:

Pay Online

All families should have received notice about their child's school fees. Please visit PowerSchool to pay your school fees as soon as possible. If you need support with this, please do not hesitate to call the office.

COOLER TEMPERATURES:

The weather has shifted to cooler temperatures. We are reminding families about the importance of ensuring that their children are dressed warmly.

Decisions regarding outdoor activities are guided by [Administrative Procedure 131](#). The suggested guideline is that students do not go outside if the temperature and wind chill factor are -20° C or colder.

Please remember that recess will be moved indoors only during extreme weather conditions, so students are to come to school dressed appropriately for the outdoors.

BUSPLANNER APP:



For the 2025-26 school year, Transportation Services office will send late bus notifications via the Division website [BusPlanner Alert](#) for delays. There is also an APP for your cellphones that will provide you with alerts for delays. The App is available for both Android and iPhone. Below are instructions on how to do this or visit [Yellow Bus Delays](#) click on **How do I set up Bus Planner Delays App?**

Download the free **BusPlanner Delays App** through the respective App Store on your phone.

Once downloaded:

1. Open the App, select the wrench at the top, select Edmonton Catholic Schools, and click next.
2. Under setup, select My Child's Bus to receive alerts.
3. Select the school(s) you would like to receive notifications and click + after selecting each school. Once you finish selecting schools, click next.
4. Select the applicable bus run(s) and click +. If you wish to receive notifications for more than one bus, repeat the process for each bus. Once you finish, click Done and the App will return to the main screen:

Please make sure notifications for the BusPlanner Delays App are turned on within your phone settings. Also, ensure your phone software is up to date. Note: Data usage and rates will occur while using the BusPlanner Delays App.

BUS DELAYS APP:

- Please check that you have all 3 runs added for the specific bus route. You must add AM (morning run), PM (afternoon run) & THURS (Thursday afternoon)

- Please note if the student's route number has changed, you must update the app with the new information. It will not be automatically updated.

SNACK, BREAKFAST PROGRAM AND CONCESSION:



Please ensure that your children have lunch packed each day. Our junior high students often come without lunch, and we are unable to provide lunch for all students that forget theirs. The concession is available for our **junior high students** who can

purchase it. If your child forgets their lunch, we will be calling you to please drop one off for them. Thank you for your understanding.

PARKING IN THE COMMUNITY:

St. Joseph High School Open House – February 24 from 6:00 to 8:00 pm

Our event is intended to provide families with as much information about the amazing programs and opportunities that St. Joe's offers. The evening will be led by our students and showcase the legacy of our school.

In our courtyard, there will be numerous post-secondary institutions and career providers, highlighting the connection between high school learning, and the world beyond graduation.

Families will be able to participate in student-led tours of our school or walk through the building on your own. St. Joe's is the only high school in Canada, that offers the programming that we do:

- Traditional Classroom Learning (TCL) – offers a structured, teacher-led environment: students attend five weekly classes focused on curricular outcomes, providing consistent classroom instruction and routine pacing.
- Guided Customized Learning (GCL) - has consistently prepared graduates for post-secondary success, fostering habits of self-regulation and independent learning valued in university and college. GCL offers a well-structured, customizable learning environment. With dedicated advisor support, personalized pacing, and meaningful assessment, students graduate equipped with both academic competence and the self-directed learning habits essential for lifelong success.
- Online Learning - is asynchronous, allowing students to work independently using the Desire 2 Learn (D2L) digital platform and Learning Guides. Teachers are available for assistance through Teams and email.

In addition, we have the largest, and most complete offerings in Career and Technology Studies (CTS), in Edmonton:

- Baking – amazing learning in a fully-equipped lab
- Culinary Arts – award winning program offered by a Red Seal teacher and 2 Red Seal Chefs
- Foods – fully-equipped lab
- Welding – large and fully equipped lab
- Autobody – one of only two high schools in Alberta that offer this program, with a Red Seal teacher
- Mechanics – very large, fully equipped lab with a Red Seal teacher
- Cosmetology – large, and fully equipped lab with a Red Seal teacher and a Red Seal instructor
- Construction – very well-equipped lab with a Red Seal teacher.
- Cabinetmaking First Period Apprenticeship Program – this is the first-year of this program, permitting students to complete their First Period Apprenticeship and move into industry and post-secondary completion for their Red Seal certification
- Communication Technology – graphic art computer-based programming, in a well-equipped lab
- Robotics – full programming in a well-equipped lab, with a CISCO certified teacher, to prepare students for IT and networking industry credentials

Fine Arts and Music programming is outstanding, with many offerings available for students:

Braided Journeys is available to assist Indigenous learners, offering academic supports, and cultural learnings. PASS (Part-Time alternative Self-Paced School) is offered every Monday and Wednesday evenings from 4:00 to 7:00 pm through Alternative Education at St. Joe's, for students wishing to take additional courses, or repeat courses.

Dual Credit courses are also offered on Monday and Wednesday evenings from 4:00 to 7:00 pm in conjunction with post-secondary institutions, permitting students to earn post-secondary credits and high school credits at the same time. This year at St. Joe's, through Alternative Education, the following programs were offered in-person:

- Aviation Avionic Technology – through Southern Alberta Institute of Technology (SAIT)
- Police Studies – MacEwan University
- Other dual credit programs are offered in an online format

A full academic program is offered for all students, in all subject areas. We currently program for 146 different in-person courses, and 96 online courses. St. Joe's offers something for every student.
